# **REPORTS** | ALIGNMENT COMMITTEE

## Background to Proposed District 17 Alignment for 2022/23.

With the impact of COVID on clubs over the last two years, there have been a few clubs that have chosen to close, a reduction in the number of members and member willing to take on District Officer roles. Taking these factors into consideration, the District Alignment Committee considered several Division and Area configurations, with the proposal to reduce the number of Division to four endorsed at the last DECM.

Several iterations of a four Division alignment were considered with the proposed alignment being endorsed by the Committee.

The naming of the Divisions is based on the previous convention used when the District had four Divisions and they are Central, Eastern, Southern and Northern.

The benefit for the District in reducing the number of Divisions is a reduction in the number of Division Directors and Area Directors that will be required. While the impact on individual clubs should be minimal.

In terms of Speech Contests, it is expected that the District will decide that two contestants from each Division will move forward to the District finals resulting in eight contestants in each contest.

Toastmaster International has several requirements related to preparing District alignments (key requirements listed below) and the Committee has considered these and the input for the Division Directors and their teams in prepared the proposed alignment. We understand that we are not going to please everyone, but we are confident going that this alignment will be the best for the District in 2022/23.

## **Toastmasters International Alignment Requirements**

Toastmasters International has various requirements that need to be taken into consideration for the alignment of clubs within a District. Some requirements are mandatory while others are factors that need to be considered to develop the alignment that suits most clubs, members, and District Officers. The key requirements are as follows:

- At least three Areas per Division.
- No fewer than four clubs and no more than six per Area.
- Geographic proximity to other clubs.
- Area Director to effectively provide service, without requiring clubs to make changes to accommodate Area Director visits.
- Club size and strength.

This is an incomplete report meaning eligible candidates can run from the floor. During the time of our nominations the District had 6 Divisions.


If we are to go back to 4 Divisions, preference of Divisions by our endorsed candidates will be taken into consideration.

# **DISTRICT EXECUTIVE | CLUB GROWTH DIRECTOR**

#### Introduction

With the March renewals just over, we can see that the District has had a significant decline in members with subsequent impact on club numbers.

COVID restrictions on terms of venue limits, vaccination requirements and online/hybrid club meetings have impacted on the ability of clubs to attract guests and convert them to members, as well as members electing not to attend meetings and to indicate that they do not intend to renew their membership. This has been an issue for the year to date in differing levels and is likely to continue for the remainder of the year.

## **Club Composition & Strengths**

The following table shows the District and Division composition, membership numbers and club strengths as they currently stand.

## Notes

We commenced the year with a base of 82 clubs and with the revitalisation of 235 Toastmasters club, this has increased to 83 clubs.

## **Member numbers**

We currently have 834 members including multiple club members separately for all their clubs, a drop from 1,217 before the March renewals. Interestingly, our member number prior to the March renewals was almost the same as when we commenced the year indicating that the number of new members has effectively equaled the number of lost members, when we had been hoping for an overall increase in members numbers.

Hopefully we can grow member numbers during the remainder of the year to offset the number that we lose at the March renewals.

#### **Paid Clubs**

The number of Paid Clubs is currently 64 clubs against a base of 83, There were 74 paid clubs before the March renewals so the overall drop to 64 paid clubs from our base of 83 paid clubs has been relatively consistent, 9 clubs unpaid in the first half and 10 clubs in the second half. In addition, the number of Charter Strength clubs has dropped from 22 to 7.

Corporate club, 235 Toastmasters club had been suspended, primarily due to them struggling to meet during COVID but with some great work from Leonor Ragan, they have been removed from suspension and Leonor is working with them to rebuild their numbers. Thanks to Leonor for this great effort. This increases our base from 82 clubs to 83 clubs.

The following clubs have recently elected to dissolve or decided to late last year, but they were included in our list of clubs at the start of the year, most of these clubs show as either Suspended or Ineligible:

- 1. Armadale (Ineligible)
- 2. Electrical Toasters (Suspended)
- 3. Energy Club (Suspended)
- 4. Geraldton (Suspended)
- 5. Gosnell Foothills (Suspended)
- 6. Meeting Procedures (Suspended)
- 7. Stanley College (Suspended)
- 8. Subiaco Early Birds (Ineligible)
- 9. Terrace (Ineligible)
- 10. Gourmet Guns N Roses (Ineligible)

In addition, there are other clubs with very low numbers, who are at risk of potentially failing, and we have been working with these clubs to assist them to build their membership strength, though some are still considering their future. With the following clubs being of particular concern due to low member numbers, though most had been actively working to increase numbers:

- 1. Plain Speakers 1 member renewed
- 2. Curtin 0 members renewed (members taking a break till mid-year)
- 3. ToastIES 0 members renewed (intending to continue, payment issue within the company)
- 4. Persuasive Speakers 0 members renewed (assessing their future, have struggled to meet and attract guests as a CBD based club)
- 5. Osborne Park 1 member renewed
- 6. Dynamic Speakers 1 member renewed
- 7. Inspiring Speakers 5 members renewed
- 8. Cannington Communicators 6 members renewed
- 9. Masters of Mentoring 3 members renewed
- 10. Perth Rainbow 7 members renewed
- 11. Leaders & Speakers 4 members renewed
- 12. CIL 7 members renewed

On a positive note, we are working to establish a number of new clubs and some of these hopefully will charter by the end of the year, though they have been experiencing the same COVID impact these prospective clubs include:

- Synergy Corporate Club
- PTA/DMR Corporate Club
- Off The Cuff

We are also working on some leads including the following:

- Amazon Corporate Club
- Energy Club with Society of Petroleum Engineers

#### **District Success Plan Status**

The District Trio produced a comprehensive District Success Plan, which was approved at the District Council meeting.

## **Membership Payments**

The October & March renewals are key points for membership numbers and club strength within the District and in both October and March, there were a large number of members who did not renew, either with any club or reduced the number of clubs that they are members of.

Given that we currently have 2,181 payments it is unlikely that we will achieve Distinguished.

The big challenges for the remainder of the year will be grow membership numbers for existing clubs and to find resources within the District to support clubs in meeting this challenge.

#### **CLUB OFFICER TRAINING**

#### Overview

We have now concluded the Club Officer Training sessions for 2021/22.

In each training round we ran a combination of in-person (3) and online events (3). The online events were either the traditional 3 hour session, or a full-day session with Club Officer Breakout sessions running sequentially.

These all-day sessions proved popular, with club officers and non-club officers attending the general interest sessions.

We did also run an in-person session in the South West which was well attended by both club officers and non-club officers.


### **Officers Attending Training**

In total, 382 out of 539 officers (71%) attended training.


Of those who attended training 60% attended the online sessions

Of those who attended training 53% chose to attend online.





# Officers Trained by Role







## Officers Trained by Division



As at 11th April, 2022, 297 individuals from 65 clubs have submitted educational awards. The majority of awards are in Level 1.






## **CLUB GOALS**

#### **Vision & District Success Plan**

We have used the Club Officer Training platform to communicate our District Vision. It is important to communicate our vision with our members to align our vision with the club's own goals and vision.

The general Western Australian community will be aware of the District and Toastmasters and know us as a place to go to improve their communication and leadership skills. The District will have established a strong base of thriving clubs, generating members who want to be in and compete for all leadership roles.

The key focus on our Success Plan is to ensure we meet our membership goals.

We are currently behind our goal in this area and we need to prioritise our resources to this.

To date we have received 2,187 payments. The same time last year we were sitting with 2,570 payments.

#### **District Officers**

We are on the search for the Black Swan Editor.

#### Contests

All Area & Division Contests have now been completed.

A big thank you to all the Division Directors, Area Directors and all the contestants and officials that have helped with these contests.

We also acknowledge the patience and flexibility of all our members and organisers in having to switch the contests to an online format at very short notice.

### **Membership Renewal**

With the Western Australian Community opening of the State Borders Covid and Mandatory Vaccination Status it will have a material impact with members renewals and has effected many of the clubs status in staying in good standing.

We will be communicating with the clubs and remind the clubs and members to renew their Toastmaster Memberships.

We have been actively promoting clubs to conduct Open House, Anniversary Meeting or Speechcraft Program it is great to see clubs taking on the important steps to recruit new members into their clubs.

Membership renewals will also be impacted with the new ERP system whereby, membership renewals, adding new members will be down from 20 April to May 8.

## Toastmasters International have a new award for this program year.

#### District Club Strength Award.

- This award looks at membership growth differently by focusing on the average number of members
  per club. When the District's average club size increases by 10% or more, we will be awarded the
  District Club Strength Award.
- At the start of January, we had an average of 15.53 members per club. If we can reach the goal of 17.08 member average will win this award for the District.


