# District 17 Program Quality Director Report



## 18 August 2023

A summary of our D17 current activities and forthcoming plans across various PQD focus areas is presented below as of August 2023.

#### **Club Officer Training (COT)**

From June to July 2023, our first round COT held four sessions—three in-person at Technology Park, Palms Community Centre, and Midland Junction Arts Centre, and one via Zoom.

Training encompassed 234 roles in 63 clubs: 53 active clubs (8+ members), 7 clubs with membership challenges (3-7 members), and 3 ineligible clubs (0 members). Notably, 42 clubs underwent thorough 4-7 officer training, while 10 clubs attended with 1-2 officers.

Afterwards certain clubs have initiated makeup sessions for specific officer roles. We're extending this effort to more clubs to cover missed officer training.

Attendance records are now accessible on the Toastmasters International website's club performance dashboard. Furthermore, the recorded online COT session and presentation materials are available for on-demand viewing on the District Google Drive, accessible to COT attendees.

Our strategy for the second round comprises a single session in November 2023, followed by one in January 2024 and two in February 2024. This approach will emphasize the equilibrium between in-person and online sessions, collaborative training material development with TLI, and the empowerment of Division and Area Directors for leadership development.

#### **Division Officer Training (DOT)**

In July 2023, two in-person training sessions were conducted to enhance Division and Area Director proficiency. Notably, all four Division Directors completed their training, and 86% of Area Directors (9 out of 11 ADs appointed) have benefited.

A final training session in September will ensure comprehensive coverage for the remaining 6 ADs who were either unable to attend (2 ADs) or await official appointments (4 ADs).

#### **Workshops**

Feedback garnered from DOT and COT sessions will direct the creation of dedicated workshops. Scheduled for three in the second half of 2023 and three in the first half of 2024, these workshops will delve deeply into key subjects, enhancing ongoing training alongside the biannual COT sessions.

Our initial online workshop, 'Building Membership Together,' concluded successfully at 3rd August, and its on-demand recording will be shared with all officers soon.

#### **Speech Contests**

Our forthcoming focus include the organisation of Humorous, Evaluation, Table Topics, and International contests for clubs, areas, divisions, and the district. The format, whether in-person or hybrid, is contingent upon the DECM recommendation and DCM approval.

Initial feedback on the proposed in-person format and 2:2:2 progression has been promising, with some members and clubs sharing their insights. The potential challenges of the hybrid format—resource strain, quality compromise, and distraction from mission-focused activities—are being meticulously addressed.

Noteworthy, Division contest dates have been finalized, with certain Division Directors securing venues. A suggested 2:2:2 progression (club, area, division, district) in conjunction with the proposed in-person format aims to amplify club participation.

The proposed approach for speech contests includes strategic collaboration with TLI for dedicated contest training, empowerment of Division and Area Directors for contest promotion and leadership growth, and the incorporation of past winners' experiences to inspire engagement in community and corporate clubs.

#### **District Conference**

The Toasting Human Energy Club has expressed interest to host the district conference and they actively explore venue options at this stage.

#### **Educational Awards**

A dedicated committee is planned to focus on pathway adoption and awards across clubs. This effort involves collaboration with district leaders and club officers to enhance the pathways education program's quality. Regular interviews with recipients of education awards will be conducted (e.g., online and in-person individual interviews and panel sessions), thereby enriching the pathway learning experience for clubs and members.

In closing, I invite your active participation and ideas to enhance the pathways educational program quality for our district clubs and members. Your contributions are pivotal to our shared success.

#### **Overall Position**

The district will be commencing the year with 52 clubs in good standing. 13 of these clubs are at Charter strength, with 20 or more members.

#### **Opportunities**

One club at Synergy/Western Power has held a Demo meeting and is on the way to chartering. A possible club at DCM Australia has held its Demo meeting and is looking at option of building charter strength or reusing another club's number.

A possible club in Karratha is organising a Demo meeting.

There is one further inquiry from Rio Tinto which is in the early stages.

#### **Growth Strategy**

CGD will meet with Public Relations Manager (PRM) to run the District Market Analysis and develop a District Marketing Plan.

CGD will meet with Area Directors to determine appetite for starting new clubs.

CGD will meet with Coaches Coordinator to appoint or develop coaches for clubs with fewer than 12 members.

CGD will recruit chairs for Club Building Committees.

#### **Forecast**

Low level goal is for this year for the district to end with 53 clubs (no net loss).

High level goal is for the district to end with 55 club (net growth of 2), which is a requirement of becoming President's Distinguished.

  - Use technology, etc to remove the need to travel to venues when possible.

    it to the members, it will save time at meetings by reducing questions to just explain
    the content and focus discussion on differing views not understanding the content.
- Know the 'Rules'.
  - o Longer term members can 'remember' the 'Rules' from the past and try to tell you what you have to do, they are often 'wrong' because the "Rules' have changed or it was never the 'Rule'.
  - o Learn the 'Rules' and don't pretend that you do when you don't go and check.
- The Old Days are over, there is no going back.
  - o COVID has changed how the world operates so there is no going back.
  - Be positive about the changes and think about how they can benefit you and the members.

Also my focus from the very beginning will be to identify future leaders as part of my role as Chair of the District Leadership Committee.

I will have more to report as the months go by.
