Overall Performance:

This year District 17 members and leaders have enjoyed many of the positive outcomes accomplished in Education and some of those educational opportunities have been the workshops presented by Bob Hooey and Darren LaCroix.

In mid March 2017 renewals were down by 820 members and today that number is 433 members needed to be distinguished. It is a very positive outcome to see such high percentage of members renewing again. We have 98.8% of paid clubs and have ranked number 1 in the Region 12 and 11th in the world. Membership payments have been completed by 88.2 % with 63.6% distinguished clubs and ranking 3rd in the Region as of 13th of May. Please continue to work in increasing membership renewals. Most importantly as a team I would like to see that your club is offering quality and fun meetings to keep the members that we already have and increase the benefit to new members to achieve a distinguished status and to spread the word to as many members of the community *as* you *can* do. I personally thank you all our members for your support and applaud our team of dedicated and courageous leaders in our district for working closely with our members.

I hope that our improved District 17 website is helping you to find the information that you require to make your Toastmasters experience more fun. Many thanks to all that have contributed to this enhancement.

District Officer Training




Club Officer Training

All of our sessions are have been completed. A total of 56 Clubs achieved 4 or greater Club Officers trained in the second round – a percentage of 67.4% of District 17 Clubs.

Distinguished Club Program

There are many ways for clubs to achieve Distinguished points. 54 of our District Clubs have achieved 3 or more DCP points this 2016-2917 year and they are well on the way to become Distinguished, Select or Presidents Distinguished clubs this year. In fact, 7 Clubs have reached Presidents Distinguished status already

District 17 Club Growth Director Report


Membership Building and Retention

Current Membership Status

76 clubs paid out of 84 clubs which in percentage terms is 90.5%.

As at the 31 March renewal deadline, 76 clubs met the minimum requirement of 8 or more paid members. There were only 6 clubs that did not meet the minimum requirement (Highgate Toastmasters Club; TLI Training Group; Talkabout Club; WA Speakers Bureau Toastmasters; Shell Australia Toastmasters Club and Meeting Procedures Toastmasters Club). Two clubs did not submit their renewals (Masters at UWA Toastmasters and Cannington Communicators).

Paid Clubs




* Information for these program years varies due to changes made to the recognition program.

There has been an increase in the number of paid clubs compared to previous years. There are 39 Clubs in "Good Standing" with 20 or more members or have the +5 members. There are 14 clubs that are with 15-19 members.

60 clubs have achieved goal 7 (4 new members) and 22 clubs have achieved goal 8 (4 more new members).

The above graph shows that the number of payments has decreased for the same period in the last 2 years (2014-15 and 2015-16), but better than previous years. At the March 2017 renewals, there 2,820 paid up members compared to 2,890 paid up members for the same time in 2015-16, a decrease of 841 renewal payments.
