



District 17 LGT Education & Training Report – Western Australia

My LGET Trajectory for 2012/2013 is to;

- Plan and implement two quality sessions for both district officer & club officer training.
- Encourage all clubs to achieve a minimum requirement of Distinguished Club Status.
- Oversee all aspects of the District Convention Contests and workshops.
- Plan and run five to six independent workshops during the current financial year.

Toastmaster International Convention ORLANDO - District Executive Training

The Lieutenant Governor Education & Training conducted includes the following maintained guidelines:

- Promoting and implementing the four core values as a scale of measurement to evaluate the success of the individual Toastmaster, club, area, division & district.
- Running a successful District Convention with specific attention on both contests & workshops.

Toastmaster Leadership Institute - District Officer Training

The TLI Training Group (formerly Marketers) are focusing on mid year District Officer Training. The first session was very successful with the majority of our District Officers trained.

The second session of DOT will be in February 2013 following the District Executive's mid year Training. We are focusing on the following areas for our Division & Area Governors;

- Implementation of the four core values scale of measurement.
- Responsibilities & parameters.
- Evaluation and assessment of the roles so far.
- Troubleshooting including identifying challenges and implementing resolutions.

Toastmaster Leadership Institute - Club Officer Training – February 2013

The TLI Training Group is currently workshopping all educational and club officer information packages.

The first COT session was extremely successful based on the feedback of all attendees. We focused on the responsibilities and requirements of each of the seven club officer roles. The request for club officers to register with their choice of one of three available sessions met with resounding success. 279 Club Officers trained (63.26%) out of 441. Minimum requirements 252 officers – (110.71%) 51 out of 63 clubs at least 4 officers trained (80.95%). 16 Central, 18 Northern & 17 Southern Clubs met requirements.

The overall evaluation assessment was 44% Excellent, 46% Very Good, 9.33% Good, 0.67% Fair. Our goal is to repeat this success in attendance, feedback and delivery of high quality information.

For the forthcoming second COT session in February 2013, we are focusing on the same four areas as outlined for DOT;

- Implementation of the four core values scale of measurement.
- Responsibilities & parameters.
- Evaluation and assessment of the roles so far.
- Troubleshooting including identifying challenges and implementing resolutions.

All 7 club officer groups will be emailed with an invitation to submit their requests and concerns. This will enable us to customise the information to fulfill the information requirements of all our club officers.

Distinguished Club Program – Educational Awards

 Central, Northern & Southern Division are progressing on the lodgment of awards; CCs (46), ACs (11), L/AL (42), LEX (6) with 3 DTMs – John Pawley, Trish Rice, Peter Jordan.

- Encourage all clubs to achieve Distinguished Status as the minimum benchmark.
- President's Distinguished Congratulations to Victoria Quay 9 (Southern)

Select Distinguished - Canning Vale - 7 (Southern) - 7,

Now that we have accurate reports for TI we can really determine the pace of our membership growth in new members and see where we are with paid clubs and renewals.

Membership Building & Retention

Final Figures for September revealed our *Smedley Award* achieving clubs and I am excited to announce that they are;

Northern Lights Canning Vale Applecross Noranda Southern River Victoria Park

Congratulations to these 5 clubs for an outstanding effort in welcoming 5 new members between August 1 and September 30, 2012.

On a world comparison, we finished equal 41st with many districts much larger than ours having less clubs achieving this award. In our Region, we equalled District 73 and were topped by Districts 70 and 72, all of whom have more than double the number of clubs we have.

Membership Building DCP Goals

As of the November 15th reports, 33 of our 63 clubs have achieved the first membership building goal and 15 of these have already achieved the second. I have sent congratulatory emails to all of these clubs with a reminder about the Marvellous Membership Building Contest since they have already achieved part of the criteria. A further 10 clubs have added 3 new members and are closing in on the first goal while 4 of the clubs that have achieved the first goal have an additional 3 new members, therefore closing in on the second goal.

New members to November 15th are **296** compared to **204** at the same time last year.

Central – 88	2011 - 70
Northern – 96	2011 - 57

October renewals to November 15th are 910 compared to 808 at the same time last year.

While this looks good compared to last year it is a different story when we look at the figures below.

Graced members to November 15th are as follows;

Central – 172 Northern – 124 Southern - 158

2 clubs are still to pay October Renewals, 1 in Central Division, 1 in Southern Division

Central – Healthy Toasters Southern – TEEM (At the time of writing this report I was assured these would be paid within a few days)

This is a huge amount of members who have not renewed their membership or the club has not paid these renewals to TI.

These lists have been split into Areas and forwarded to all Division Governors and Area Governors to chase up in the next few days.

New Clubs

Leonor and her team held a very successful demonstration meeting at Bankwest where they had at least 25 members join. They have named their club **ToastiES** and have submitted all charter documentation and payments to TI. By the time of this meeting I expect this club to have chartered. **Madison** is ready to charter. David Nicholas and Ross Wilkinson are working with the club executive to finalise the paperwork.

I have had contact from *KPMG* regarding a club within this company. I am meeting with them in the next few days to finalise a demonstration meeting.

David Nicholas has been contacted by **Seasons Funerals** in Canning Vale regarding setting up a club and they are working to hold a demonstration meeting in mid to late January 2013.

Sir Charles Gairdiner Hospital is moving very slowly.

Phoenix is building slowly.

Peter Adams from Northern Lights and Mike Helm are working on starting a new club in the **Department of Training** in Osborne Park. Mike thinks this will happen soon.

We have a possibility of starting a club for *City Square*. We are following up with this contact and will have more information soon.

We have a possibility of starting a club in the **WA Mines Department.** We are following up with this contact and will have more information soon.

The Club Sponsors, Mentors & Coach Programme (SMAC)

Greg Madden, Mike Palmer & I have organised a varied & interesting programme which should leave many members wanting to become a sponsor, mentor or coach. As this was the first time this training workshop has been held in our district I believe we can all learn from this and improve for the future. From this workshop I will begin a Club Coach List to be maintained by the District for clubs requiring one at present and into the future.

Conclusion

It was difficult for the first few months of the Toastmasters year with reports that were inaccurate and fleeting but I am happy to report that it is much less stressful now that we have reports from TI which are accurate. I am reasonably happy with our membership payments but I am concerned about our retention rate with so many graced members. The next few weeks look like being busy chasing up these renewals, new club leads and following up after the SMAC Programme.

DCP Goals – Each area is aware that the Distinguished Club Program (DCP) is not just a "numbers game". The areas identified in the DCP, all form - KPI's – indicators on the "health of a club". It can highlight positive and challenging trends of a club. Knowing these outcomes can assist a club implement strategies that can circumvent trouble ahead.

The other end of the spectrum is identifying implemented strategies that have flipped a weakness to strengthen. These strategies and methodologies can be shared with other clubs experiencing similar challenges who can adopt and massage these "tools" to fit within their club's profile and demographic.

Most of the clubs attended the training. There was unfortunately a few that did not attend, which may have impacted on the operations of the club. Training is there to equip committee members to be forearmed with what is required of them. It is essential for them to understand how they fit in with the leadership of its members while encouraging and equipping the members of the club, to meet everyone's needs (regardless of their duration of attendance).

The percentage of people trained show that most people, as agreed to when they took on the role, attended has equipped them for the year ahead. This reduces the individual stress and greatly adds to the cohesion and functionality of the club.

Contact with Area Governors

Initially establishing a team of Area Governors proved very challenging. This was exacerbated by the recent resignation of an area governor, due to work commitments and reprioritising of life

goals. This happens from time to time in the toastmaster life, and we adapt and move forward. Each challenge is an opportunity to grow in strength and share the outcomes with others ensuring they can build on our experiences: "Our ceiling becomes the floor from which they build." These challenges enhance learning in toastmasters.

PMTM is climbing steeply from the runway, bootstrapping its experiential base, focusing on developing a cadre of confident program participants. We look forward to their emergence, to their benefit, into the contest and District scene.

Cole Vindevoghel, President of PMTM, did the club proud by undertaking the Chairmanship of the Area Contest.

As a general rule, where possible roles were filled with a view to enhancing member experience.

Project Managers (trying to do what they know) is making a project of it, and it will be interesting to see it evolve beyond 'painting by numbers'.

While the club is by-design homogeneous, the time will come when some may reincarnate over the fence, perhaps extending their art into management, small business, or other areas where their meals do not need to be slid under the doors of their cubicles. Subiaco EB has experience and an ambience all of its own. It is distinguished by a wry, longsuffering sense of humor, perhaps reflecting its Health and Welfare demography. It is haunted by its nominal membership base.

UWA TM

Immediate Past Area Governor Liz Fisher (SEB) undertook the UWA visit in my absence, (I am not a Friday person), for which we thank her. (Also for her tremulous support of my efforts in general.)

UWA Toastmasters, like each of the clubs in this boutique Area has made appropriate adaptations to its circumstances, negotiating a complex dynamic between staff and the FIFO-like comings and goings of students.

A fruitful arrangement, making a unique contribution to the Area, (Saddam Hussein as an exemplary leader!) with occasional support from DivGov (C) Ragan.

TLITM

TLI pleases itself, which is not entirely unreasonable, but is a little provoking. To be fair the ubiquitous Pascale and Leonor warrant 'roasting'.

"TLI is a club formed by existing members in order to meet District and individual leadership goals. They provide no participation or support to the other clubs in the Area and give the illusion that the Area is bigger than it is."

Club Officer Training

All clubs achieved the requisite attendance at the first round of training. In fact St George's and UWA overshot. This is lovely, and high energy in general is great. Our concern will be to ensure that we can also obtain a clean sweep in the second round.

Contests

With the exception of PMTM and TLI the clubs completed successful contests in good time, resulting in three participants in each segment of the Area Contest at the SEB venue at PMH.

Other Information/Comments

" ... it might warrant a comment or two in the Area report regarding focussing on the membership that we already have. I saw the latest email from the District and it looks like ... a lot of clubs lost guite a few members in this latest round of renewals.

So what I'm getting at here is a possible comment about asking the clubs in our district to focus on what we can do to engage our existing members and make the meetings more enjoyable for them, as well as the new members.

It's the traditional trade-off between marketing/growth aimed at new members and development/appreciation of existing members. And it focuses on something that the District has identified as a current issue."

"I share your feelings about the pressure concerning numbers. This arises for the most part from the need to have sufficient clubs and members to remain a district in our own right ... (interesting personal insights) ... I personally feel a few more years of growth and consolidation should have occurred before we split from District 73.

However, my experience is that clubs need members - meetings cease to be enjoyable after a while if attendances remain low, something I feel is an unacknowledged issue at present."

I am, unlike a James Bond martini, shaken AND stirred at finding myself shanghaied into the Area Governor role, several months late and annoyed at a resurgence of my old codependent tendencies, weakening at the wrong moment. My carer had left the room.

In doing so, I am reinforcing an unfortunate systemic tendency to build Toastmaster facades; clubs and areas, looking a little like Dodge City, awaiting John Wayne or Clint (I talk to chairs) Eastwood.

It is lovely to crack a bunch of DCP's but if it all depends upon a cadre of weary recycled officers who have already done the job, morphing into authority figures in the process, there is a need to worry. The Emperor's slip is slipping. Dysfunction.

The District has flourished like an algal bloom, vigorously, brilliantly, partly by being very selective about which aspects of Toastmasters that it employs. ("We don't bother with ..." Make a list.)

It has rocketed up the drain-pipe (mixed metaphor) and just a little bit lost its way? It is now facing some interesting challenges, should it wish to look. (With authority, this is an international phenomenon. At least the secret police are not involved, as far as I know.) Is there a risk of implosion? Is the District promoting leadership or management, communication or speechifying? Bottom up or top down? Which way up is the pyramid? Of what would a healthy area consist?

Good systems produce healthy dynamics, personal evolution, and happy campers; primitive systems lead into crises, puppet mastery 101, regular 'rescue missions', and growing resentment ("I have to do everything!") among recycled office holders.

Learners become 'experts', explorers hang up their spurs, collaborative learning becomes authoritarian teaching and learning, leadership becomes 'management', and motivation becomes ranting while the audience sits on their hands (waiting their turn). And we get caught up in rescue missions, like the Lone Ranger, joining/helping multiple struggling clubs that somehow don't know as well as we do. How did that come about? Systemic. Authoritarian?

It would be interesting to develop a more subtle metric of Area health. It is a desperate need, or not, depending upon one's motives.

For example, % of club officers who are holding their particular position for the first time =? (100% would be good, with the next generation 'shadowing'; Immediate PP creating a 'slate'. As per the manuals.) District Membership/Members. Does it matter? Contested. Similarly with the AG - seriously contested elections (see the book) rather than the eerie tap on the shoulder: an indicator of systemic dysfunction, puppet mastery 101.

Also, of members on the books, follow the procedures and flush the 'ghosts' – in that they haunt the meetings, and depress the club, and scare off potentially dedicated members, while padding the DCP. See Club Constitution Article II, Sec. 4 ("We don't bother with that!" "Really?" It's a nonsense.)

And % of members who complete their CC in ?? years rather than core + bums on seats. How many do not complete 5 speeches, CC, CC & CL, how many even buy that they can enhance their leadership capabilities in a TM club? What do they see? Other measures easily spring to mind that would reflect the vibrancy of the system. Vitality and skill rather than facades and life support.

Are we leading, (skillfully employing Senate meeting procedures) or administering? (Because we are scared of healthy meeting procedure.)

Are experienced Toastmasters degenerating into 'teaching' the newcomers what they know - (art becoming join-the-dots technology), or jointly exploring beyond mutual frontiers?

Are we generally bringing into Toastmasters what we already do, more of the same, low level administration, and talking as telling, or emerging into the terrifying journey of visionarycollaborative-synergistic leadership? Bringing about intelligent change? Of course the constituency of D17 has engaged conditionally with the TM Pledge; shaped by the algal bloom strategy. And I respect that; but regret it. It could be left behind now.

What is it that self-motivated, ambitious, visionary joiners are looking for? If they join, ... or do not see, and amble away. Caterpillar (join-the-dots) training in perpetuity, or doing the groundwork for transformation into their next metamorphosis? Movement or atrophy?

District 17 Area Governor N23 Report – Western Australia

All clubs in Area N23 began the year below charter strength and still are. Kalamunda has reached a net increase of six so hopefully this will be retained at March renewals. The main goal for the year is to get all clubs to twenty members or at least a net gain of five. Each club has a strong core of members, there being members in each club who have been division governors and/or area governors. In addition, each club has committed club officers. All clubs are working towards obtaining goals and have well planned programs to work towards the objectives. I am confident that each club will attain enough goals to reach distinguished club or better but most will need to increase membership to reach distinguished club level. All clubs have a friendly atmosphere and warmly welcome visitors. Meetings are lively and fun while not losing sight of the goals to be achieved.

All except one club had the required number of officers trained in July. Three clubs had six trained, one club had five but the other had only three. All clubs have had the officer list and one renewal on time.

Swan club began the year on a very positive note when John Pawley was awarded DTM the day after he completed his year as Area Governor for N23. Swan has been struggling to build up numbers despite promoting the club. Janette Edwards, a dual member of Mundaring, is to be appointed as a coach. As the committee has been mainly the same members in recent years a new perspective may be what is required. Swan is strong on looking after current members but needs to attract more visitors as potential members.

Mundaring has seen a slump in membership and among those who remain several are often away for work. The president, Annemarie de Heus, is working on a High Performance Leadership project based on membership building. This involves not only creating publicity by various means to attract members but by tailoring meetings to retain the current members. This project will extend into the second half of the year and has a band of willing helpers who have volunteered to deal with different aspects.

Ellenbrook meets weekly so those who work away have more opportunities to attend. Although the membership is below base level the club has succeeded in enlisting four new members before the end of October. At this rate the club is well on track to obtaining the required number to be distinguished. Meetings are lively with members ready to step in for those who are absent. Because the venue is above the library any late comers can't be admitted. Problems have arisen when the library has locked up a few minutes early.

Guildford Stars is also gaining new members. One visitor was full of praise for the helpful way her query had been handled after a bad experience on contacting another club. The members are very inclusive of visitors. Membership has increased above base level. Meetings are dynamic and to a theme. The venue is well signed to overcome any difficulty in locating the building within the school grounds.

Kalamunda has been strong on enrolling new members. They are close to their second membership goal and have already had a net gain of more than five. The meetings are vibrant and good use is made of humour. The atmosphere is friendly and inviting. The club should be able to reach distinguished or better if membership is retained.
