For the Period 1 January 2013 - 30 June 2013 and for the year ended 30 June 2013

To the District 17 Executive Committee

1. Scope of Audit

- 1.1 The Audit Committee, comprising of Tim Blackburn (chairman), Terrence Cheong and Barry Tregenza, audited the accounts for District 17 for the second six months of the financial year 1 January 2013 30 June 2013 in accordance with guidelines issued by TMI Finance.
- 1.2 We also completed the year end audit for the financial year ended 30 June 2013 in accordance with the guidelines issued by TMI Finance.

2. Findings

- 2.1 The Audit Committee believes that the accounts accurately reflect the financial transactions on and the status of the District 17 accounts for the period 1 January 2013 30 June 2013 and has found the accounts and supporting documentation to be in order.



Toastmasters' is a unique organisation. We all set communication and leadership goals. We formulate strategies to achieve this with the assistance and support of our clubs. We take advantage of the positive impact that Toastmasters can have on our lives. We all try to contribute by making a positive impact in as many Toastmaster I i v e s as possible. Our fellowship contributes and enhances our Toastmaster j o u r n e y and we endeavor to enhance the Toastmaster j o u r n e y s of all our colleagues. The District Success Plan is a scale of measurement of our Key Performance Indicators.

International Convention 2013 – Cincinnati

Toastmasters is a unique organisation. When I first joined over eight years ago, my scope of this organisation did not go beyond my home club. As each year has passed, through the leadership opportunities, I developed an understanding of this organisation's great dynamics.

I was fortunate to travel with Lieutenant Governor Education & Training, Robyn Richards and Lieutenant Governor Marketing, Ian Pickens to the Toastmasters International Conference which in Cincinnati, OHIO, United States.

We departed on Thursday, 15th August. We had a five hour flight to Sydney, followed by a sixteen hour flight to Dallas and a connecting flight to Cincinnati. We had the opportunity to acclimatise over the weekend. Several days of intense training for our respective roles followed. We had the opportunity to speak to many other District Trios from around the world. This was invaluable to compare and contrast all our successes and challenges. There were several common themes, all the Trios we spoke to had the same challenges of membership retention and membership renewals. World Headquarters specified the most important function is the be of service to the member. The member always comes first.

We interviewed twenty candidates for the International Director positions. It was enlightening to witness Toastmasters operating on a global level. This prepared us for the most important event, to attend the Annual General Meeting in which seven of the International Director Positions were elected and the incoming International President George Yen succeeded outgoing International President John Lau. We were very proud of Mike Storkey who won the 2nd International Vice President Seat by a major landslide. Mike had completed his two years of service as Region 12 International Director over a year ago.

Our proudest moment was been welcomed onto centre stage and acknowledged and acknowledged by Outgoing International President John Lau, as one of 12 Districts to have achieved President's Distinguished Status.

Thank you to all the clubs that submitted their proxies. This was an opportunity for your voice to be heard and to have an impact in voting in both International Officer elections and Proposal A.

I have been humbled and inspired by the commitment of our members, our club officers and our district officers. We still have a long year ahead to succeed in achieving our goals and most importantly looking after the needs of all our members.

The 2013/2014 District Success Plan

The District Executive has been developed the current District Success Plan.

This is based on the results of the previous year in which District 17 achieved President's Distinguished Status. The statistics in red indicate our current status.

There are 3 main areas, which operate as key performance indicators.

- 1) **Membership Payments** our annual goals are as follows; for District 17 to achieve Distinguished status 3,038, Select Distinguished 3,148, President's Distinguished 3,248. **Current status** 1,353 membership Payments.
- 2) Distinguished Clubs we need the following number of clubs achieving a minimum of Distinguished Status (5 out of 10 points of the Distinguished Club Program. We need; 28 clubs to achieve Distinguished Status, 32 clubs to achieve Select Distinguished and clubs bs to achieve President's Distinguished.

Current status – 10 clubs have achieved a minimum of Distinguished status

235 Toastmasters in Area C2, Central Division.

The 2013/2014 Toastmaster Year

The year ahead will require an equal commitment and perseverance to maintain the success and growth of District 17. I am proud d to be serving alongside a very driven and dedicated team of district officers and club officers.

The four vital areas and goals which are the main focus of this year.

- 1 Membership Growth & Membership Retention we need to ensure that we are maintaining our Toastmaster Pledge and Promise to new members and existing members. The membership is the most important component in our District.
- 2 Club Growth & Club Stability we will be supporting the growth of new clubs and assist existing clubs with rebuilding and stabilising membership.
- Promotion of the Distinguished Club Program to help our members achieve their individual goals, clubs achieve and benefit from the success of their goals. Encourage all clubs to achieve a minimum requirement of Distinguished Club Status.
- 4 Promote and implement the Mentorship Program into every club within the District. The most successful districts in our global network all have succinct mentorship programs, for both new and existing members.

New Clubs Status Update.

I am proud to announce that our first club 235 Toastmasters (C1) has chartered. The new Toastmaster year is barely a month old with our first success. Congratulations to Robyn and Mark Richards who were the driving force in making this success a reality.

David Nicholas and John Palmer are spearheading Spearwood (S32) and Canning Vale Storytellers (S31) respectively. Ivan Henderson and Touch Of Gold Toastmasters Club are having a demonstration meetings for Golden Gourmet and WA School of Mines, both in N24. TOG is sposoring both clubs with stater kits and are planning their launches in late January/early February 2014. Peter Harrison is working at Currambine (N21). He has secured two club sponsors and two club mentors. The venue is been finalised. Currabine will launchon January 22nd, 2014.

We have several more Corporate Club leads to investigate and follow up on.

Lieutenant Governor Marketing, Ian Pickens is leading the team of New Club Coordinators; VK Kutty (Central, Martin Lindsay (Northern) and David Nicholas (Southern).

Distinguished Club Program – Educational Awards

Last year, 11 Toastmasters achieved their Distinguished Toastmaster Award. This is the highest award Toastmasters bestows on a member as it recognises both the communication and leadership skills that the member has completed. An estimated 12,000 of

toastmaster's 4 million past and present members have achieved the elite Distinguished Toastmaster status. The achievement of the Distinguished Toastmaster award is recognition of both individuals' commitment to Toastmaster's communication and leadership tracks.

To date District 17 has lodged 38 CCs, 31 Advanced Communicator Awards, 38 Leadership awards including 6 DTMs. We now have 6 Toastmasters who have achieved their DTM. In order of lodgement dates, joining Greg Lynn of Netmasters, David Nicholas of Victoria Quay, and Meechan Wong of Banskia; Congratulations to Anita Adhitya of Young Guns, Sandra Morton of Cannington Communicators and Robyn Richards of Canning Vale for achieving DTM status this year. This is Robyn Richards' 2nd DTM. We are all very proud of your commitments and achievements.

Distinguished Club Status – Congratulations

I will congratulate Victoria Quay for its achievement of becoming the first club to achieve President's Distinguished Status with 9 out of 10 Distinguished Club Points.

Congratulations to Canning Vale, Southern River and Murdoch Southsiders for achieving Select Distinguished Status.

Congratulations to Young Guns, Gourmet Guns N' Roses, Rockingham, City of Perth, Fremantle gateway and Applecross for achieving Distinguished Status. We acknowledge your commitment to achieve and setting a positive example for other clubs to follow.

Membership Payments – Immediate Attention Required

I will recognise and acknowledge all clubs who have submitted their September membership renewals on time. There are still several clubs that need to act upon this immediately.

If renewals are not submitted, a club in good standing. This could have a negative impact on all members who wish to compete in the Table Topics and Humourous Speech Contests, and the International Speech and Evaluations Contests. If a member or club is not in good standing, the contestant is ineligible to compete in any contest at any level.

I am aware that there are clubs who may have existing members not renewing due to work commitments and to achieving their original Toastmaster goal. Sometimes we forget that not every Toastmaster wants to embark on the DTM journey.

Of the clubs still to renew, a team will travel down to Margaret River Toastmasters to assist in rebuilding the club. The futures' of both Madison and Phoenix Toastmasters are looking very grim.

District 17 Workshops - Humorous and SMAC Success

This month the successful Humourous and SMAC (Sponsors, Mentors & Coaches) workshop were well attended at Curtin Technology Park in Bentley.

64 Toastmasters attended the Humourous Workshop in which veteran Toastmaster and author, Alison White discussed her years of experience as a Humourous Speech Contestant and outlined strategies and interactive discussions to help all achieve a better understanding in the dynamics of humour. Alison, the District acknowledges your contribution as a workshop presaenter.

47 Toastmasters attended the SMAC (Sponsors, Mentors & Coaches) which followed after the lunch break. District Secretary Lisa Evans discussed the benefits of becoming a Club Sponsor, Lieutenant Governor of Education Robyn Richards outlined the advantages of becoming a Club Mentor and Lieutenant Governor of Marketing Ian Pickens discussed the rewards of becoming a Club Coach. I have been working closely with the new area governor and I'm pleased to report that she has been equal to the task and has brought much commitment, attention to detail and enthusiasm to the role. I am confident that this area will be a distinguished area or better by 30 June next year.

I am fortunate as I have a great team of area governors to work with and feel that the best is yet to come for Central Division this year.

Clubs

Area C1 – Includes new and more established clubs. There are 3 clubs with a membership that exceeds charter strength and another which is close to charter strength.
