LGET Report for DMM January 18, 2014

November saw the highly successful Darren Fleming Leadership Workshop held before our District Council Meeting and the Steve Bullock Membership Building in a Mature Market Workshop held after our District Council Meeting. Both were well attended and the feedback was positive.

December was quiet on the educational workshop front with the Christmas break allowing clubs and members to enjoy the season.

Educational Awards

During November we had 10 x CC, 1 x ACB, 4 x CL, & 1 x LDREXC awards lodged.

During December we had 7 x CC, 1 x ACB, 2 x ACS, 4 x CL & 1 x ALB awards lodged.

Educational awards submissions has not slowed very much at all, which is excellent for the district.

DCP Goals

Clubs are steadily achieving **educational** DCP goals with 36 of our 70 clubs having achieved at least 1 goal by December 31, 2013. This is an increase of 3 clubs achieving goals during November and December. 11 of these clubs had 5 or more goals as of December 31, 2013.

TLI in February

Once the agenda is finalised, I will be asking each Division Governor to organise their own session by putting together the presenters and helpers. Dates and venues have been finalised; February 8 at Bob Daniel Centre, February 13 & 16 at Technology Park.

Future Training

Andre Sequeira has decided he cannot commit to presenting "From Speaker to Trainer" in March 2014. I will try to acquire another presenter for this workshop.

On the same day I would like to have a follow up to the "Step Up" training which will be held at TLI in February. This training will be called "The Next Step" and will be dedicated to analysing current club quality by using the Moments of Truth workshop we covered at Midyear District Leader Training. This will be primarily for Area & Division Governors but open to all members who have shown an interest in a leadership role in the future. This will be run by Division Governors with the Trio overseeing.

Convention 2014

Brad Hogg has been secured as a presenter on Sunday and Steve Bullock is requesting to visit again so I have asked him to present at our DTM Breakfast. Steve will confirm when he has permission from WHQ.

Conclusion

Successful workshops in November were received well by our members whilst we all had a well-deserved break in December. Future Training events are coming together as is Convention 2014. I am happy with our clubs educational DCP goals at this stage of this Toastmasters year.
